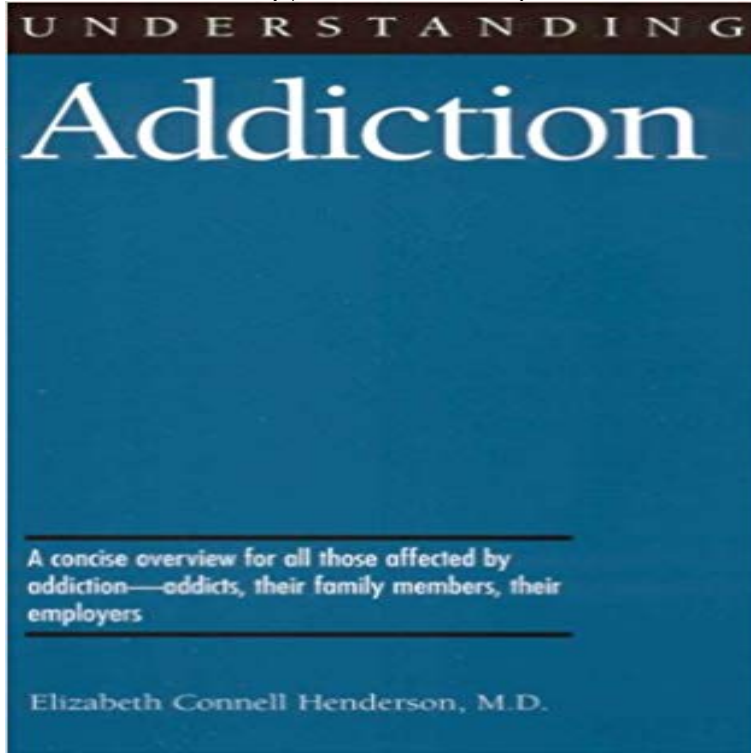


Understanding Addiction (Understanding Health and Sickness Series)

What organizations are available for help and how are they contacted? For human resource workers, attorneys, social workers, nurses, corrections officers, school counselors, and teachers, the book provides a framework of
